**Condition:** The unit is engaged in operations. An OPORD/OPLAN has been issued. All CPs are operational and can send and receive reports and overlays. The TOC has been established. The commander has given his guidance and specified his intent and that of the next higher commander. The commander has issued his critical information requirements (CCIR). The DST and synch matrix have been developed. The staff sections have created appropriate base overlays for the current operation. A convoy has been engaged and taken several casualties. There is one reported KIA, several critically injured and two showing signs of combat stress. They are being transported to a medical aid station in your area. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4. This task should be trained under IED Threat conditions.

**Standard:** The UMT performs and provides religious crisis response IAW TACSOP, RS Annex, RS Matrix, the MASCAL Plan, and procedures directed by command and/or described in FM 1-05, to include all coordination and reporting.

**Safety Risk:** Medium

## TASK STEPS

- \* 1. Unit Ministry Team prepares a comprehensive religious support plan to include mass casualty plan
  - a. Determine UMT casualty replacement plan
  - b. Identify locations of the UMT for each phase of the operation
  - c. Include casualty religious support plan for the unit operating area
- \* 2. Receive Commander's approval for plan
- \* 3. Submit Religious Support Matrix for inclusion into the unit OPORD
- \* 4. Distribute plan and matrix to all subordinate units if applicable
- \* 5. Chaplain assistant serves as religious services staff member in the absence of the chaplain
  - a. Coordinates religious support in the absence of a chaplain
  - b. Accesses the main CP in the absence of the chaplain
- \* 6. Monitor casualty data to determine religious support requirements
  - a. Provide religious support to a wounded/dying individual
  - b. Provide Emergency Religious Ministrations of the Eucharist
  - c. Provide religious support for a Mass Casualty Event
  - d. Provide religious support to a suicidal person
  - e. Provide religious support to combat stress casualties
  - f. Provide religious support to caregivers
  - g. Provide Traumatic Event Management
  - h. Provide religious support to the Next of Kin (NOK) during death notification
- \* 7. Apply the principles of privileged communication at all times
- \* 8. Inform command of religious support provided
- \* 9. Inform supervisory chaplain of religious support provided

Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT. Environmental protection is a continual process. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment and reduce waste.

**Safety:** In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Everyone is responsible for safety. A thorough risk assessment must be completed prior to every mission or operation.
