

## ART 7.3.1.2 Conduct Disarmament, Demobilization, and Reintegration of Former Combatants

Disarmament, demobilization, and reintegration of former combatants is fundamental to most efforts to establish stability and lasting peace. It includes physically disbanding armed groups, removing the means of combat from former combatants and belligerents, and reintegrating them into society. Disarmament may include seizing ammunition, collecting and destroying weapons and supplies, closing weapons and ammunition factories, and preventing resupply.

01	Yes/No	Unit established border security, including customs regime to prevent arms smuggling, interdict contraband (such as drugs and natural resources), prevent trafficking of persons, regulate immigration and emigration, and establish control over major points of entry.
02	Yes/No	Unit trained and equipped border control and boundary security personnel.
03	Yes/No	Unit established and disseminated rules pertaining to populace movement and curfews.
04	Yes/No	Unit assisted in establishing a policy to regulate air and overland movement.
05	Yes/No	Unit transferred responsibility for movement regulations to the indigenous populations and institutions, nongovernmental organizations, or other government agencies as appropriate.
06	Yes/No	Unit provided full freedom of movement.
07	Yes/No	Unit dismantled roadblocks and established checkpoints.
08	Time	To establish identification rules and protocol relating to personal identification, property ownership, court records, voter registries, birth certificates, and driving licenses, including securing documents.
