The commander tasked the staff to prepare a Battalion TACSOP and has provided initial guidance. The UMT is responsible for writing the Religious Support Appendix portion for inclusion into the battalion TACSOP. This task should not be trained in MOPP 4.

Standard: Develop a TACSOP that provides tactics, techniques and procedures for providing religious support for the BN Mission in accordance with FM 1-05.

Performance Steps

1. Receive guidance from S3.

- a. Verify proper Appendix for Religious Support input.
- b. Verify format for Appendix information.

Note: NOTE: Information and format for TACSOPs differ from unit to unit. The information provided in this task is one example of a Religious Support Appendix to a TACSOP. UMTs will follow prescribed format as provided by command and/or supervisory chaplain. UMT determines what information is provided in the TACSOP but ensures sufficient information is provided to adequately describe the UMT religious support mission during exercises or major combat operations.

2. Determine information for inclusion into RSA.

- a. Coordinate with the chaplain assistant for information to be included into the RSA.
- b. Request assistance from supervisory chaplain, if required.
- c. Check for existing information/appendix.

3. Draft initial RSA.

- a. Ensures heading and classification are in accordance with (IAW) format provided by S3.
- b. List all References, Paragraph 1.
- c. Describe the Purpose of the Appendix, Paragraph 2.
- d. Describe the scope, Paragraph 3.
- e. List responsibilities, Paragraph 4.

(1) Describe the responsibilities of the battalion chaplain.

(2) Describe the responsibilities of the battalion chaplain assistant.

f. List general information regarding religious support, Paragraph 5.

(1) Describe support to casualties.

(2) Describe humanitarian support/coordination.

(3) Describe EPW support/coordination and support for those involved with detainee operations.

(4) Describe Civil Affairs support/coordination.

(5) Describe Media interaction coordination.

g. Identify Command and Control information, Paragraph 6.

(1) List and describe reports that will be submitted to higher headquarters.

(2) Describe replacement procedures for chaplain and/or chaplain assistant.

4. Staff initial draft for Commander, Command Sergeant Major, Executive Officer, and supervisory chaplain for review/approval.

a. Prepare Staff Action form for routing.

b. Provide hard copy or electronic copy to individuals for review.

c. Receive input (corrections, deletions, format changes, approval, etc.) from command and incorporate changes into final draft of document, if required.

5. Submit approved Religious Support Appendix to appropriate staff section for incorporation into Battalion TACSOP.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Soldier GO if all performance measures are passed. Score the Soldier NO GO if any performance measure is failed. If the Soldier score NO GO, show the Soldier what was done wrong and how to do it correctly.

Evaluation Preparation: Soldier should be evaluated based on their ability to perform the tasks in accordance with the performance measures described in class. Soldiers who miss any performance measure should be retrained and reevaluated.

Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
