Performance Steps

1. Identify the target audience for training.
 - a. Determine number of participants.
 - b. Determine appropriate rank/grade of audience.
2. Develop a training outline for the audience.
 - a. Access possible sources containing appropriate training material.
 - b. Develop appropriate training materials for presentation.
3. Schedule training through the S3.
 - a. Coordinate date, time and location for training.
 - b. Ensure training is placed on the unit training calendar.
 - c. Coordinate participant requirements with Company Commanders/First Sergeants.
4. Brief Commander.
 - a. Informs commander of date, time and location of training events.
 - b. Receives approval from commander for training.
5. Secure facility for training.
 - a. Coordinate with appropriate section/agency for use of facility to provide class.
 - b. Ensure facility supports equipment and personnel.
6. Publicize the training event.
 - a. Provide FRAGO through the S3, if required.
 - b. Informs unit personnel through training/staff meetings.
7. Conduct training.
 - a. Define suicide.
 - b. Identify the three major danger signs of suicidal behavior.
 - c. Identify leaders'/Soldiers' roles in recognizing suicidal behavior.
 - d. Identify facts and myths concerning suicide.
 - e. Acquaint leaders/Soldiers with installation helping agencies.

- f. Perform a suicide risk assessment.
- g. Identify the indicators of a suicidal person.
- h. Refer suicidal person to the appropriate agency and follow up.

8. Conduct AAR following training event.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT. Environmental protection is a continual process. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment and reduce waste.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Everyone is responsible for safety. A thorough risk assessment must be completed prior to every mission or operation.
