Standard: Synchronize religious support across the brigade area of operations in order to maximize Soldiers' worship opportunities, while minimizing duplication of effort and disruption to mission planning, preparation, and execution.

Performance Steps

1. Review the Religious Support Running Estimate.
2. Analyze planned operations and current Religious Support Running Estimate for Religious Support implications.
3. Analyze current array of forces, task organization, list of units assigned/attached to the brigade area and all brigade controlled installations for religious support implications.
4. Develop an Area Coverage Plan.
 - a. Coordinate with S-3 for a list of units in the brigade area that have no formal relationship with the brigade but may require religious support, such as security force assistance teams, military transition teams and others.
 - b. Analyze which units and installations fall under brigade responsibility for religious support. Include Joint implications in the analysis.
5. Analyze brigade religious preference profile for religious support implications.
6. Determine the name, number and location of Soldiers in the brigade area of operation who have unmet religious support needs due to shortfalls in low density religious support providers.
7. Compile a list of all routine RS activities planned across the brigade combat team footprint.
8. Compare items on the list with one another and with current or planned operations.
9. Ensure special religious support activities such as memorial ceremonies do not conflict with the mission to facilitate maximum worship opportunity with minimum mission disruption across the brigade area.
10. Advise the chaplain on your analysis.
11. Update the Religious Support Estimate with the analysis from steps 1 through 10 in conjunction with the brigade chaplain's guidance.
12. Revise the Religious Support Plan according to the brigade chaplain's guidance.
 - a. Re-arrange religious service schedule to minimize conflict with mission requirements and minimize duplication of effort.
 - b. Shift subordinate Unit Ministry Teams to cover remote locations as necessary.
 - c. Task subordinate Unit Ministry Teams to support non-organic teams operating in the brigade area.
 - d. Submit a request to the next highest headquarters for any necessary low density faith group providers.
13. Coordinate the delivery of low density religious support providers such as, but not limited to, Catholic priests, rabbis and imams from echelons above brigade to lower echelons.
 - a. Ensure that the gaining unit has enough advance notice to publicize the planned event.
 - b. Ensure that departure and arrival times are synchronized with the operational tempo of gaining units as much as possible.
 - c. Ensure that the gaining unit has an alternative plan for movement in the event primary means of travel is unavailable or unsuitable.

d. Ensure the gaining unit has identified appropriate low density Soldiers and has a plan for getting them to the service and or circulating the provider to Soldiers' work areas.

e. Ensure the subordinate UMT has a plan for hosting the low density provider, i.e., lodging and meals and delivering him/her to the next phase of movement.

f. Publish the details of the delivery plan in a fragmentary order.

g. Monitor the circulation of the religious support provider during their movement in the brigade area until their return to the higher echelon headquarters.

Evaluation Guidance: Soldier may be evaluated orally or in written form by briefing what they completed on each performance step and why any step did not apply in this situation.

Evaluation Preparation: Set-up: Tell the Soldier to brief orally or in written form what they completed on each performance step and explain why any step did not apply in this situation.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Everyone is responsible for safety. A thorough risk assessment must be completed prior to every mission or operation.
