## Performance Steps

1. Beach a class A vessel
  - a. Alerts crewmembers of intended beaching.
  - b. Monitor that crewmembers report to his/her assigned station.
  - c. Ensures that crew checks to see that all equipment and cargo are properly secured.
  - d. Ensure crewmembers are wearing the proper gear.
  - e. Monitor that Soldiers are in good communications with the bridge by:
    - (1) Calling out proper distances over the radio
    - (2) Ensuring that the vessel commander is aware of any hazards in the water

2. Retract a class A vessel
  - a. Monitor that crew prepares the vessel for sea.
  - b. Alerts crewmembers of intended retraction from the beach.
  - c. Monitor that crewmembers are on station and raise and dog the ramp
  - d. Monitor that once free of the beach the crew conducts checks of all equipment and lashing gear on deck

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
