### Performance Steps

1. The staff officer confirms proper manning of the protection warfighting function staff in accordance with the commander's intent, orders from higher headquarters, operational requirements, and unit manning rosters.
2. The staff officer confirms that the protection warfighting function staff conducts basic initial staff duties and assumes responsibilities by:
  - a. Informing the commander of all mission related staff tasks.
  - b. Developing and maintaining running estimates.
  - c. Providing recommendations.
  - d. Preparing plans, orders, and other staff writing.
3. The staff officer organizes, manages, monitors, trains, and inspects the protection warfighting function as specified in FM 7- 15, The Army Universal Task List C-10 (February 2009):
  - a. Art 6.1- Employ air and missile defense.
    - (1) Process tactical aerial platforms.
    - (2) Destroy aerial platforms.
    - (3) Deny enemy use of airspace.
    - (4) React to enemy aerial attack.
    - (5) Plan ballistic missile defense.
    - (6) Conduct ballistic missile defense.
    - (7) Manage system configuration.
    - (8) Plan rocket, artillery, and mortar defense.
    - (9) Conduct rocket, artillery, and mortar defense.

**Environment:** Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT.

**Safety:** In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
