ART 1.5.2 Occupy an Attack and Assault Position

As part of an offensive operation, move tactical forces into and through these positions to prepare for further action or support actions of another force. Activities include making last-minute coordination and tactical adjustments, preparing specialized equipment for immediate use, and protecting the occupying force until supporting fire is lifted or shifted. This task includes the use of attack-by-fire and support-by-fire positions and holding areas by attack helicopters. (FM 3-90) (USACAC)
