  - a. Develop a unit religious preference profile based off a current ad hoc query from the S1 (personnel) shop.
  - b. Conduct an informal survey (one on one or in small groups) of your troops to solicit information on their level of interest and topics important to them.
  - c. Determine the religious education needs according to faith groups and unit feedback.
2. Select a course of action to address the identified need.
3. Determine appropriate theme and curriculum for the event.
4. Prioritize and synchronize the event against the unit's critical time driven events.
5. Obtain commander and/or supervisory UMT approval of event.
6. Write an Operations Order (OPORD) for CDR's signature that details responsibilities and the five Ws - Who, What, When, Where, Why.
7. Provide for the religious education event.
  - a. Arrange for funding of the event.
  - b. Determine if you will perform the event or provide.
  - c. Arrange for appropriate personnel to perform if needed.
  - d. Coordinate for location and site support of event.
  - e. Coordinate with higher headquarters UMT for low density faith group resources.
8. Collaborate with supervisory and peer UMTs for input and/or assistance.
9. Advertise with the unit for event as appropriate.
10. Conduct weekly IPR leading up to the event.
11. Evaluate the event with an After Action Review (AAR).

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**Safety:** In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Everyone is responsible for safety. A thorough risk assessment must be completed prior to every mission or operation.
