TASK STEPS

1. The staff coordinates the initial phase to establish an interim criminal justice system by:
 - a. Assessing the current legal framework.
 - (1) Using internationally accepted model codes as templates.
 - (2) Determining if the legal framework needs modification.
 - b. Deploying interim justice personnel.
 - (1) Facilitating host-nation criminal justice system.
 - (2) Determining interim justice positions to create.
 - (3) Developing vetting criteria with which to evaluate prospective interim justice personnel.
 - c. Establishing review mechanisms to reduce pretrial detention.
 - d. Managing interim legal codes.
 - (1) Facilitating the mission.
 - (2) Tracking with international law.
 - e. Assessing host nation capacity to combat crime.
2. The staff develops host nation justice institutions under the control and supervision of transitional civil authorities.
 - a. Monitors developments and reports concerns through their chains of command.
 - b. Extend justice systems to jurisdictions that were previously not under control.
3. The staff coordinates for transfer of responsibility to the host nation justice institutions as well as monitors and reports progress.
 - a. Facilitates host nation training and growth.
 - b. Observes host nation criminal justice system to ensure it is self-sustaining.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. .
