Performance Steps

1. Account for human remains and personal effects.
 - a. Place the human remains in a serviceable human remains pouch (HRP).
 - b. Log in the human remains using DD Form 1077.
 - c. Inventory all personal effects on DD Form 1076 and DD Form 1076C.
 - d. Fill out two evacuation tags and attach to the human remains and the human remains pouch.
2. Prepare litters.
 - a. Place a sufficient amount of litter stands inside the refrigeration unit, spaced evenly apart.
 - b. Ensure all litter stands are serviceable.
 - c. Place litters on top of litter stands and align them correctly.
3. Load human remains.
 - a. Place the human remains on the litters, loading them on a first received/first evacuated basis.
 - b. Ensure that the human remains are handled in a respectful and reverent manner.
 - c. Carry the human remains feet first and face up.
 - d. Place the human remains shoulder-to-shoulder.
4. Prepare refrigeration container.
 - a. Maintain the refrigeration unit's temperature between 34 and 40 degrees Fahrenheit.
 - b. Do not freeze the human remains under any circumstances.
 - c. Check the temperature at periodic intervals.
 - d. Perform maintenance checks as prescribed in applicable technical manuals on the refrigerator unit and generator.
 - e. Ensure that the refrigeration container doors remain secured at all times.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Soldier GO if all steps are passed (P). Score the Soldier NO-GO if any step is failed (F). If the Soldier fails any step, show what was done wrong and how to do it correctly.

Evaluation Preparation: Use a predetermined site and provide the Soldier with all required materials and equipment. Tell the Soldier that a mannequin will be used in place of a deceased Soldier for training purposes. The Soldier should treat the mannequin as though it were an actual fatality.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with FM 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete a DA Form 7566 COMPOSITE RISK MANAGEMENT WORKSHEET during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
