Condition: You are a Master Sergeant Chaplain Assistant in an operational environment with subordinate RSTs/UMTs reporting up their religious support operations and requests. Given access to staff personnel, secure communication equipment, maps and displays. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4.

Standard: In accordance with the Commander's Intent and the higher headquarters concept for Religious Support, demonstrate the ability to coordinate High Demand/Low Density (HD/LD) Religious Support in cooperation with the staff, while generating fresh courses of action and within operational timelines.

Performance Steps

1. Receive notification from higher HQ of high demand/low density (HD/LD) asset.

2. If no notifications come from higher HQs, then request religious support for HD/LD faith group coverage when necessary, i.e.:
 - a. Jewish Holy Days
 - b. Muslim Holy Days
 - c. Hindu Holy Days
 - d. Catholic Holy Days

3. Acquire religious preference profile.

4. Analyze religious preference profile for high demand / low density faith groups.

5. Determine need and utilization in area of operation (AO) of HD/LD coverage.

6. Write warning order/FRAGO informing lower echelons.

7. Coordinate air/ground movement of HD/LD assets and/or Soldiers.

8. Write order/FRAGO to subordinate echelon.

9. Record and monitor HD/LD coverage.

10. Brief commander on all HD/LD and report to higher Corps HQs.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Soldier a GO if all performance measures are passed. Score the Soldier a NO GO if any step is failed. If the Soldier fails any step, show or tell him/her what was done wrong and how to do it correctly.

Evaluation Preparation: Evaluate this task during either garrison training or a field environment. Give the evaluated Soldier guidance, purpose, reference material and situational awareness of the mission so they can accurately demonstrate the 'know how' of Coordinating High Demand / Low Density Religious Support in the Operating Environment. Brief Soldier that he/she will be evaluated on his/her ability to perform the task as each performance step indicates.

Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT. Environmental protection is a continual process. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment and reduce waste.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with FM 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete a DA Form 7566 COMPOSITE RISK MANAGEMENT WORKSHEET during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Everyone is responsible for safety. A thorough risk assessment must be completed prior to every mission or operation.
