Performance Steps

1. Compare all compatible environmental references.
2. Conduct environmental officer role.
 - a. Develops the Battalion/Brigade Environmental Program.
 - b. Evaluate lower echelon environmental program.
 - c. Perform duties as a subject matter expert for environmental requirements.
 - d. Coordinate training.
 - e. Conduct brigade, battalion and unit self-assessments.
 - f. Implement planning procedures and risk assessments.
 - g. Manage the Commander's environmental policies.
 - h. Integrate with other environmental officers and higher level environmental offices.
3. Determine an effective environmental program.
 - a. Emplace a trained and effective primary and alternate designated environmental officer on appointment orders.
 - b. Issue applicable references.
 - c. Train Soldiers and Civilians.
 - d. Develop, assess and update the environmental SOP.
 - e. Maintain environmental files, records, Company to Brigade level self assessments, inspections and checklists.
 - f. Manage the environmental corrective action plan(s).
 - g. Review existing policies, procedures, past assessments and identified deficiencies, conduct an initial assessment, complete a risk assessment. Develop or update the environmental SOP.
4. Implement new environmental program or changes to the existing program.
 - a. Conduct and document training.
 - b. Procure all necessary supplies such as PPE, spill kits adequate for the unit, secondary containment and other items to implement the environmental program.
5. Provide Personnel Training.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Soldier a GO if all performance measures are passed. Score the Soldier a NO GO if any performance measure is failed. If the Soldier scores a NO GO, retrain and retest.

Evaluation Preparation: Test this task in conjunction with other predeployment measure testing. Ensure that access to FM 3-34.5 and current FGS are available.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
