**Condition:** The unit is conducting operations as part of a higher headquarters and has been in contact with the enemy. The unit must consolidate and reorganize. The unit has communications with higher, adjacent, and subordinate elements. Enemy forces have withdrawn to hasty defensive positions but have the capability to counterattack. The unit is provided guidance by the Rules of Engagement (ROE). It may also have Mission Instructions, such as a peace mandate, Terms of Reference, and Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA). Coalition forces, noncombatants, government agencies, nongovernment organizations, and local and international media may be in the operational environment. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4. This task should be trained under IED Threat conditions.

**Standard:** The unit consolidates and reorganizes in accordance with the unit's standard operating procedures (SOP), OPORD, and higher commander's guidance. The unit conducts reconnaissance, establishes security, and position elements. The unit reorganizes by redistributing or cross-leveling ammunition and equipment, mankeyweapon, replacekeypersonnel, treatand evacuatecasualties, and revisescommunicationas necessary.

## TASK STEPS

### 1. Unit conduct consolidation activities--

- a. Establish 360-degree local security.
- b. Conduct reconnaissance and security patrols.
- c. Establish observation posts/outposts.
- d. Emplace early warning devices.
- e. Establish and register final protective fires.
- f. Seek out and eliminate enemy resistance(on and off the objective).
- g. Assign principal directions of fire [PDFs] to Soldiers manning automatic weapons.
- h. Establish sectors of fire and other direct fire control measures for each subunit/Soldier.
- i. Provide guidance on protection requirements such as digging/building fighting positions.

### 2. Unit conduct reorganization activities--

- a. Resupply and redistribut ammunition and other critical supplies.
- b. Man key weapon systems.
- c. Reestablish the chain of command.
- d. Maintain communications and reports, to include—
  - (1) Restore communication with any unit temporarily out of communication.
  - (2) Send unit situation reports.
  - (3) Send SITREPs (at a minimum, subordinates report status of mission accomplishment).
  - (4) Identify and request resupply of critical shortages.
- e. Perform special team actions such as—
  - (1) Treat and evacuate wounded personnel.
  - (2) Evacuate friendly KIA.
  - (3) Treat and process EPWs.
  - (4) Segregate and safeguard noncombatants/ refugees.

(5) Search and mark positions to indicate to other friendly forces that they have been cleared.

f. Integrates replacement Soldiers and systems into the unit.

g. Establish unit command post.

Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. .
