1. The staff assesses police-related civil considerations and the criminal environment by:
  - a. Evaluating police and prison structures.
  - b. Monitoring organized criminal networks.
  - c. Identifying legal systems.
  - d. Confirming investigation and interview procedures.
  - e. Reviewing crime-conducive conditions.
  - f. Determining enforcement gaps and mechanisms.
  
2. The staff develops a plan to establish host-nation police training that conforms to international law and secures and protects the population by:
  - a. Identifying evidence or crimes.
    - (1) War crimes.
    - (2) Crimes against humanity.
    - (3) Transitional crime.
    - (4) Corruption.
    - (5) Violent extremism.
    - (6) Organized crime.
    - (7) Financial crime.
    - (8) Human trafficking.
    - (9) Narcotics.
  - b. Training to recognize such evidence.
  - c. Identifying and detaining perpetrators.
  - d. Controlling the vetting process of existing host-nation police forces by:
    - (1) Evaluating host-nation personnel hired to assist in law enforcement reform.
    - (2) Obtaining an accounting of host-nation police and law enforcement personnel.
    - (3) Developing police recruitment programs.
    - (4) Establishing appropriate behavioral, physical, and moral standards for police.

**Environment:** Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT. .

**Safety:** In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. .
