**REVIEW TEST:**

Given a series of Article 15s in the unit, the commander’s tasking to conduct Moral Leadership Training, all necessary resources for guidance and assessment, design a one year training plan to address identified unit needs, and develop and present a Moral Leadership Training Support Package (TSP) for one of those needs.

## Performance Steps

1. Conduct ethical risk assessment.
  - a. Receive commander's initial guidance.
  - b. Conduct unit ministry team unit survey.
  - c. Survey unit leaders and other UMTs.
  - d. Interview Soldiers.
  - e. Conduct informal visits.
2. Brief Courses of Action (CAO) to commander.
  - a. Identify 2 - 3 COAs.
  - b. Brief commander.
  - c. Receive commander's guidance.
3. Develop training program.
  - a. Identify target audience.
    - (1) Determine number of participants.
    - (2) Determine appropriate rank/grade of audience.
  - b. Develop a training outline.
    - (1) Access possible sources containing appropriate training material.
    - (2) Develop appropriate training materials for presentation.
  - c. Synchronize training with S3 and company commanders.
    - (1) Coordinate date, time and location for training.
    - (2) Ensure training is placed on the unit training calendar.
    - (3) Coordinate participant requirements with Company Commanders/First Sergeants.
  - d. Coordinate with appropriate sections/agencies for necessary resources and facility.
  - e. Prepare Memorandum of Instruction/FRAGO for commander's signature.
4. Conduct training.
  - a. Provide appropriate moral leadership instruction.

b. Solicit feedback and interaction from participants.

5. Conduct AAR following training event.

**Environment:** Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT. Environmental protection is a continual process. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment and reduce waste.

**Safety:** In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Everyone is responsible for safety. A thorough risk assessment must be completed prior to every mission or operation.
