Conditions:

The squad is conducting operations in a live training environment as part of a platoon or larger force. The squad receives an order to knock out a bunker. The enemy initiates contact from a concealed bunker network. All or part of the squad is receiving accurate enemy direct fire. Some iterations of this drill should be performed in MOPP 4 and at night.

Standards:

The squad knocks out a bunker according to ATP 3-21.8. The squad destroys the designated bunker by killing, capturing, or forcing the withdrawal of enemy personnel. The squad maintains a sufficient fighting force to repel an enemy counterattack and continue operations.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with current Risk Management Doctrine. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW current CBRN doctrine.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to the current Environmental Considerations manual and the current GTA Environmental-related Risk Assessment card.

Cue: The squad receives an order to knock out an enemy bunker from which it is receiving fire.

Coaching Point: 1. The squad is conducting operations as part of a platoon or larger force and grenades are being used. Squad/team leader caution Soldiers on the hazards that grenades pose.

- 2. During clearing the bunker, Soldiers enter immediately after the grenade detonates and enter firing aimed bursts into their sectors engaging all hostile targets to cover their entry.
- 3. Squad/team leader caution Soldiers about the hazards that ricochets pose.

TASK STEPS

1. The squad receives orders to knock out a bunker and—
a. The squad leader assigns a team as the assault team.
b. The squad leader assigns a team as the support by fire team.
2. The squad moves along the covered and concealed route to an assault position then—
a. Ensures their movement do not mask fires.
b. Constantly watches for other bunkers or enemy positions in support of the bunker being knocked out.
3. The squad establishes local security and adds suppressive fires against the enemy.
* 4. The squad leader positions where to best control the teams.
* 5. On order, the support by fire team leader:
a. Positions weapons and machine guns based on METT-TC.
b. Suppresses the bunker and enemy supporting positions.
* 6. On order, the assault team leader:
a. Directs buddy team #1 (team leader and automatic rifleman) remain where they can cover buddy team #2 (grenadier and rifleman).
b. Signals buddy team #1 to lift or shift fires to the opposite side of the bunker from the buddy team #2 approach.
c. Directs buddy team #2 moves to a blind spot and knock out the bunker.
(1) First Soldier takes up a covered position near the exit.
(2) Second Soldier announces, FRAG OUT, and throws a grenade through an aperture.
(3) After the grenade detonates, the first Soldier covering the exit enters first and the team clears the bunker.
d. Buddy team #1 moves to linkup with buddy team #2.
e. The assault team leader:
(1) Inspects the bunker.
(2) Marks the bunker according to unit SOP.
(3) Signals the squad leader that the bunker is clear.
* 7. The squad leader accounts for Soldiers, provide a SITREP to the platoon leader, consolidate and reorganize as necessary, and continues the mission.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

TASK MEASURES

- 1. The squad received orders to knock out a bunker.
- 2. The squad moved along the covered and concealed route to an assault position.
- 3. The squad established local security and added suppressive fires against the enemy.
- 4. The squad leader positioned where best to control the teams.
- 5. The support by fire team leader positioned weapons and directed suppression of enemy bunker.
- 6. The assault team leader directed the knock out of the bunker then inspected, marked and signaled the bunker was cleared.
- 7. The squad leader accounted for Soldiers, provided a SITREP to the platoon leader, consolidated and reorganized as necessary, and continued the mission.

Talk:

a.Orientation: The objective of this battle drill is to destroy a bunker by killing, capturing, or forcing the withdrawal of enemy personnel in the bunker.

b.Safety: Teams must be briefed on hand grenade safety. The chance of fratricide increases when the assault element reaches the bunker and the support element shifts or ceases fire (direct fire and indirect fire) on the bunker.

c.Demonstration: If another squad has successfully performed this drill, have that squad demonstrate. During the demonstration, explain what is being done and why using the performance measures as a guide. After the demonstration, summarize the actions performed by the demonstrating squad.

d.Explanation: (1) Refer to the performance measures and explain what the assault and support element and key leaders are required to do during movement to the bunker and during the assault.

- (2) Ensure that key leaders and buddy teams knows their duties and responsibilities pertaining to each portion of the drill.
- (3) Ask if there are any questions pertaining to the drill. If so, ensure that all questions are correctly answered before beginning to train the drill.

e.Unit Instructions: a. Resources.

- (1) Tables of organization and equipment assigned and assigned personnel.
- (2) Fragmentation hand grenades and bunker marking materials.
- (3) Opposing Forces (OPFOR): Two to three enemy Soldiers per bunker.
- b. The squad is ordered to knock out a bunker.

Walk:

- 1. Refer to the performance measures.
- 2. Have each team and Soldier perform their part slowly at first as the leader talks them through.

Run:

a.Run-Through Instructions: The squad should practice this drill until they can perform it according to standard without using notes. Soldiers should conduct the initial run-through exercise slowly. The Soldiers should change positions to learn all steps and standards.

b.Coaching Point: 1. The squad is conducting operations as part of a platoon or larger force and grenades are being used. Squad/team leader caution Soldiers on the hazards that grenades pose.

- 2. During clearing the bunker, Soldiers enter immediately after the grenade detonates and enter firing aimed bursts into their sectors engaging all hostile targets to cover their entry.
- 3. Squad/team leader caution Soldiers about the hazards that ricochets pose.

c.Performance Instructions: When the squad can perform this drill according to the standard, the platoon leader or platoon sergeant should evaluate them.
