

ART 7.3.1.1 Restore and Maintain Order

Operations to restore order are conducted to halt violence and to support, reinstate, or establish civil authorities. These operations provide security and stability after a conflict while setting the preconditions for beginning disarmament, demobilization, and reintegration. This is critical to providing effective security for the local populace by reducing their exposure to the threat of violent conflict and help military forces establish a sustained peace by focusing on processes and activities fundamental to conflict transformation. (FM 3-07) (USACAC)

01	Yes/No	Vulnerable elements of population (dislocated civilians) were protected.
02	Yes/No	Security forces ensured humanitarian aid and access to endangered populations and refugee camps.
03	Yes/No	Civilian police functions included investigating crimes and making arrests.
04	Yes/No	Unit supervised incarceration processes and transfers to prison facilities.
