Conditions:

The squad is conducting operations in a live training environment independently or as part of a platoon or larger force. The squad is dismounted. While stationary or moving, the enemy engages the squad with direct fire. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4 and at night.

Standards:

The squad reacts to direct fire contact while dismounted according to ATP 3-21.8. The team in contact returns fire immediately and seeks cover. The team in contact locates the enemy and places well-aimed fire on known enemy positions. Leaders point out enemy positions and identify the types of weapons, such as small arms and light machine guns. The team not in contact assume the nearest covered and concealed position. The squad leader (SL) reports the contact.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with current Risk Management Doctrine. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW current CBRN doctrine.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to the current Environmental Considerations manual and the current GTA Environmental-related Risk Assessment card.

Cue: The drill begins when the enemy initiates direct fire contact.

Coaching Point: Always be aware of squad members locations to prevent fratricide.

TASK STEPS

- 1. The team in contact immediately returns well-aimed suppressive fire on known or suspected enemy positions while taking up a covered position.




Figure 1. Return fire and nearest covered and concealed position

- 2. The team not in contact assumes the nearest covered and concealed position. (see Figure 1.)

- * 3. The team leaders engage known or suspected enemy positions with well-aimed suppressive fire and report information to the squad leader.
- * 4. The team leaders control the fire of their teams by using standard fire command (initial and supplemental) containing the following information:
 - a. Alert.
 - b. Weapon or ammunition (optional).
 - c. Target description.
 - d. Direction.
 - e. Range.
 - f. Method.
 - g. Control (optional).
 - h. Execution.

- i. Termination.
- 5. Soldiers maintain visual or vocal contact with their team leader and the other Soldiers on their left or right (if applicable).
- 6. Soldiers maintain contact with the team leader and indicate the location of enemy positions.
- * 7. Leaders visually or vocally check the status of their personnel.
- * 8. The team leaders maintain visual contact with the squad leader.




Figure 2. Well-aimed fires and SL control

- * 9. The squad leader moves up to a covered and concealed position where best to observe, communicate, and control the engagement. (see Figure 2.)

- * 10. The squad leader determines whether or not the squad can gain and maintain suppressive fires with the team already in contact (based on the volume and accuracy of enemy fires against the team in contact).
- * 11. The squad leader confirms the commanders criteria to disengage and determines whether or not the squad must move out of the engagement area.
- * 12. The squad leader makes an assessment of the situation and identifies
 - a. Location of the enemy position and obstacles.
- b. Size of the enemy force engaging the team in contact. (The number of enemy automatic weapons, the presence of any vehicles, and the employment of indirect fires are indicators of enemy strength.)
 - c. Vulnerable flanks.

- d. Covered and concealed flanking routes to the enemy positions.
- * 13. The squad leader decides whether to conduct an assault, bypass (if authorized by the platoon leader), or break contact.
- * 14. The squad leader reports the situation and begins to maneuver the squad.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

TASK MEASURES

- 1. The team in contact immediately returned well-aimed suppressive fire on known or suspected enemy positions while taking up a covered position.
 - 2. The team not in contact assumed the nearest covered and concealed position.
- 3. Team leaders engaged known or suspected enemy positions with well-aimed suppressive fire and reported information to the squad leader.
 - 4. Team leaders controlled the fire of their teams by using standard fire commands (initial and supplemental).
 - 5. Soldiers maintained visual or vocal contact with their team leader and Soldiers on their left or right (if applicable.)
 - 6. Soldiers maintained contact with the team leader and indicated the location of enemy positions.
 - 7. Leaders visually or vocally checked the status of their personnel.
 - 8. Team leaders maintained visual contact with the squad leader.
 - 9. Squad leader moved up to a covered and concealed position where best to observe, communicate, and control the engagement.
 - 10. Squad leader determined whether or not the squad could gain and maintain suppressive fires with the team already in contact.
- 11. The squad leader confirmed the commanders criteria to disengage and determined whether or not the squad must move out of the engagement area.
 - 12. Squad leader made an assessment of the situation.
 - 13. The squad leader decided to conduct an assault, bypass (if authorized by the platoon leader), or break contact.
 - 14. Squad leader reported the situation and began to maneuver the squad.

Talk:

a.Orientation: The objective of this battle drill is to react to direct fire contact while dismounted.

b.Safety: Squad members must be briefed on using well-aimed controlled fire, identifying enemy forces, and commands.

c.Demonstration: If another squad has successfully performed this drill, have that squad demonstrate the drill. During the demonstration, explain what is being done and why using the performance measures as a guide. After the demonstration, summarize the actions performed by the demonstrating squad.

d.Explanation: (1) Refer to the performance measures and explain what the leaders and squad members are required to do on enemy contact.

- (2) Ensure that leaders and squad members understand their duties and responsibilities pertaining to each portion of the drill.
- (3) Ask if there are any questions pertaining to the drill. If so, ensure that all questions are answered before beginning to train the drill.

e.Unit Instructions: The dismounted squad is moving and the enemy initiates contact.

Walk:

- 1. Refer to the performance measures.
- 2. Have each team and Soldier perform their part slowly at first as the leader talks them through.

Run:

a.Run-Through Instructions: The squad should practice this drill until they can perform it according to standard without using notes. Soldiers should conduct the initial run-through exercise slowly. The Soldiers should change positions to learn all steps and standards.

b.Coaching Point: Always be aware of squad members locations to prevent fratricide.

c.Performance Instructions: When the squad can perform this drill according to the standard, the platoon leader or platoon sergeant should evaluate them.
