## Performance Steps

1. Assess EW operations.
2. Develop Electronic Warfare (EW) actions to be included in the OPLAN and fire support plan.
3. Incorporate EW Intelligence Preparation of the Battlefield (IPB) into the operations process.
4. Coordinate intelligence support requirements for BCT and subordinate units EW operations.
5. Prioritize subordinate units' EW target IAW commander's guidance and objectives.
6. Participate in the targeting work group.
  - a. Evaluate offensive and defensive EW requirements.
  - b. Determine electronic attack requirements for HPTs and HVTs during the targeting working group.
  - c. Ensure electronic attack meets the desired effects for the targeting objectives.
  - d. Recommend electronic attack courses of action.
  - e. Communicate electromagnetic interference reports to the targeting working group.
7. Coordinate with signal intelligence staff element electronic warfare support and information requirements.
  - a. Manage electronic attack mission management at the tactical operations center, joint operations center, and the tactical air control party.
  - b. Manage ground or airborne electronic attack as the jamming control authority.
  - c. Request theater Army electronic attack support.
8. Maintain assessments of EW resources available to the unit.

**Evaluation Preparation:** Setup: Ensure that all information, references, and equipment required to perform the task are available. Use the performance measures and the references to score the Soldier's performance. Brief the Soldier. Tell the Soldier what he is required to IAW the task conditions and standards.

Leaders will complete a DA Form 7566 COMPOSITE RISK MANAGEMENT WORKSHEET during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, NBC Protection, FM 3-11.5, CBRN Decontamination.
