1. Assist in determining Fire Support (FS) tasks from maneuver Operation Plan and higher Fire Support Plan.
 - a. Determine commander's intent and guidance for Target Acquisition (TA).
 - b. Determine capabilities and limitations of TA assets.
 - c. Analyze effects of IPB on TA.
 - d. Develop draft Fire Support Tasks (FST).
 - e. Develop draft TA related Commander's Critical Information Requirements (CCIR).
 - f. Assist in the preparation of the briefing to the Commander.

2. Integrate TA into the concept of operations.
 - a. Determine High Payoff Targets for each COA.
 - b. Determine assets to acquire and attack.

3. Produce TA Assets Deployment Order.
 - a. Identify the capabilities of the FA Target Acquisition assets.
 - b. Define the limitations of the FA Target Acquisition assets.
 - c. Identify the employment of the FA Target Acquisition assets.
 - d. Identify weapon locating radar system zones in support of maneuver commander.

Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
