1. Define the Army's Environmental Program

a. Environmental Stewardship - It requires Soldiers to prevent environmental problems by caring for their resources. Soldiers must accept responsibility for these resources.

(1) Enhance Combat Readiness.

(2) Ensure Mission Completion.

(3) Conserve the fighting Strength.

(4) Protect the Environment.

(5) Reduce the Army's and Nation's current and future costs for environmental restoration.

6. Train environmental planning objectives - Identify available resources, identify actions required prior to the training event and prepare an environmental risk assessment.

7. Present corrective actions if necessary.

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Soldier a GO if all performance measures are passed. Score the Soldier a NO GO if any performance measure is failed. If the Soldier scores a NO GO, retrain and retest.

Evaluation Preparation: Test this task in conjunction with other predeployment measure testing. Ensure that access to FM 3-34.5 and current FGS are available.

Tell the Soldier to develop an environmental plan for the AO and be prepared to brief the findings to the Commander in order to provide protection of Soldier's health while protecting the environment.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
