Performance Steps

1. Create threat model.
 - a. Develop threat templates.
 - b. Determine the threat's tactics and options.
 - c. Determine High Value Targets (HVT).
 - d. Determine High Payoff Targets (HPT).
 - e. Determine the Priority Information Requirements for each High Payoff Target.

2. Determine threat capabilities.
 - a. Update reconnaissance and surveillance information.
 - b. Analyze relative combat power.
 - c. Synchronize collection efforts.
 - d. Develop Target Selection Standards and Attack Guidance Matrix.
 - e. Develop Target Synchronization Matrix.

3. Update threat model.
 - a. Develop enemy Situational Template (SITEMP).
 - b. Overlay enemy Situational Template (SITEMP) with Friendly Forces.
 - c. Develop Enemy most likely COA and most dangerous COA.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Warrant GO if all steps are passed (P). Score the Warrant NO-GO if any step is failed (F). If the Warrant fails any step, show the Warrant what he/she did wrong and how to do it correctly.

Evaluation Preparation: Setup: Ensure that all information, references, and equipment required to perform the task are available. Use the performance measures and the references to score the Warrant's performance. Brief the Warrant. Tell the Warrant what he/she is required to do IAW the task conditions and standards.

Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
