Conditions: The platoon is conducting operations in a live training environment independently or as part of a company or larger force. The platoon makes unexpected contact with the enemy. The platoon receives fires from enemy weapons, visually acquires the enemy, or makes contact with an enemy obstacle. Indirect fire and close air support are available. The platoon is conducting operations at night in a dynamic operational environment against a single threat. All personnel and equipment are available. The platoon has communications with higher, adjacent, and subordinate elements. The platoon has guidance on the rules of engagement (ROE).

Dynamic Operational Environment: Requires three or more operational and two or more mission variables change during the execution of the assessed task.

Single Threat: Regular, irregular, criminal, or terrorist forces. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4.

Standards: The platoon conducts action on contact according to ATP 3-21.8, the order, and the commander's guidance. The platoon in contact deploys, reports and initiates fires to destroy or suppress the enemy. The platoon conducts necessary battle drills, maneuvers to bypass, withdrawals, or assaults the enemy position. The platoon maintains communications with higher headquarters and supporting fires. The platoon complies with the ROE.

The mechanized infantry platoon (ABCT) has at least 6 of 7 (75%), rifle platoon (IBCT and SBCT) has 5 of 6 (75%), tank platoon (ABCT) has at least 3 of 4 (75%), assault platoon (IBCT) has 4 of 5 (75%), mobile gun system (MGS) platoon (SBCT) has 3 of 4 (75%), scout platoon (ABCT, IBCT and SBCT) has 5 of 6 (75%), the anti-armor platoon (SBCT) has 3 of 3 (75%), and the mortar platoon (ABCT, IBCT, and SBCT) has 6 of 7 (75%) of the platoon's leaders and 80% of the Soldiers present at training against the platoon's authorized strength. The platoon attains 80% on performance measures, 100% on critical performance measures, and 85% on leader performance measures achieving a T (fully trained).

Note: The mechanized infantry platoon (ABCT) leaders are the platoon leader, platoon sergeant, section leader (x2), and squad leader (x3).

Note: The rifle platoon (IBCT and SBCT) leaders are the platoon leader, platoon sergeant, squad leader (x3), and weapons squad leader.

Note: The tank platoon (ABCT) leaders are the platoon leader, platoon sergeant, and tank commander (x2).

Note: The assault platoon (IBCT) leaders are the platoon leader, platoon sergeant, section leader, and squad leader (x2).

Note: The MGS platoon (SBCT) leaders are the platoon leader, platoon sergeant, and vehicle commander (x2).

c. Selects a COA as listed below:		
(1) The platoon leader selects an appropriate course of action based on commander's intent, guidance, and orders; factors of METT-TC; the analysis of the situation; and input from subordinate units In contact as described below:		
(a) Directs the platoon to execute the original course of action, as previously addressed in the FRAGORD if it is consistent with the commander's intent and is within the unit's capability.		
(b) Issues a FRAGORD to refine the plan based on the situation ensuring it supports the commander's intent.		
(c) Directs the platoon to execute tactical movement (employing bounding overwatch and support by fire [SBF] within the unit) and reconnaissance by fire to further develop the situation.		
(d) Directs the platoon to establish a hasty defense and SBF position.		
(2) The platoon leader recommends an alternate COA to the commander as follows, if necessary, based on the developing situation:		
(a) Sends recommendation to the higher headquarters (HQ) commander.		
(b) Receives orders to execute the COA selected by the higher HQ commander.
