3. Determine type of waste based on the condition of the munition.
 - a. Used or Fired Munition.
 - b. Unused munitions.
 - c. Munitions used for intended purposes.
4. Transport hazardous waste (munition) according to CFR 40 Parts Subpart M Para. 266.203.
5. Store hazardous waste (munition) as described by Title 40 CFR 266.205.
6. Treat and dispose of hazardous waste (munition) as described by RCRA Title 40 CFR Parts 260-270.
