Performance Steps

1. Identify mission command during defense support of civil authorities (DSCA).

a. Title 32, United States Code (USC) or state active duty status units - the National Guard (including the Army National Guard and Air National Guard) are state forces and remain under the command of the governors of their respective states, unless mobilized for federal service under Title 10, USC.

b. Title 10, USC status units - Regular Army forces and Army Reserve units always remain under the command of the President of the United States, exercised through the Secretary of Defense and the various combatant commanders.

2. Identify where missions are performed during DSCA.

a. Title 32, USC or state active duty status units - within respective state or territory and according to emergency management assistance compact or state-to-state memorandum of agreement.

b. Title 10, USC status units - perform missions worldwide.

3. Identify funding during DSCA.

a. State active duty status units - state government funded.

b. Title 32, USC status units - federal government funds administered by the state.

c. Title 10, USC status units - federal government funded.

4. Identify the types of missions performed during DSCA.

a. State active duty status units - includes riot control, law enforcement, and emergency (incident) response within their state.

b. Title 32, USC status units - disaster and law enforcement missions. Title 32 status for incident response requires a disaster or emergency declaration by the President.

c. Title 10, USC status units - cannot perform law enforcement, strictly limited by the Posse Comitatus Act, standing executive orders, and department of Defense directives. In a large-scale disaster, the President may direct that federal military forces support federal agencies, but these forces will remain under federal, not state command.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Leaders will complete a DA Form 7566 COMPOSITE RISK MANAGEMENT WORKSHEET during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, NBC Protection, FM 3-11.5, CBRN Decontamination. In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment IAW FM 5-19, Composite Risk Management.
