**Condition:** Given access to the Installation EOC and the Emergency Operations Center SOP or Reserve Continuity of Operation Plan (RCOOP); ability to input a Religious support Annex to the SOP; a central location from which to direct the actions of subordinates; telephonic, radio or digital connectivity with the EOC and subordinate UMTs; ability to monitor local events through official channels or open source news outlets. This task should not be trained in MOPP 4.

**Standard:** Demonstrate the ability to integrate Religious Support into the installation Emergency Operations Center or Reserve Continuity of Operation Plan, through a comprehensive mission command methodology, and by completing all performance measures.

## Performance Steps

1. Determine critical events which may require emergency Religious Support (RS) on the installation under dynamic conditions. Such events may include but are not limited to:

- a. Natural disasters such as flood or earthquake.
- b. Evacuation of noncombatants.
- c. Fire or HAZMAT spill.
- d. Active shooter or terrorist attack.

2. Write an RS appendix to address potential disaster events and integration it into the installation Emergency Operations Center standing operating procedures (SOP) RCOOP or related plans or orders.

Note: For Reserve Chaplain Assistants who may not work on an active installation with an Emergency Operations Center, Religious Support disaster plans should be integrated into the Reserve Continuity of Operation Plan (RCOOP).

3. Staff the RS plan with subordinate Unit Ministry Teams (UMTs).

4. Rehearse the plan ICW the appropriate installation agencies and higher/adjacent/subordinate UMTs.

- a. Ensure the Installation UMT has a viable command post from which to RS conduct operations.
- b. Ensure the UMT has a viable means of communication and mission command for RS during emergency operations.

5. Monitor local information IOT assess the situation and respond to RS needs.

6. Mobilize UMT personal to provide RS during the event.

- a. Provide Chaplain coverage in the EOC
- b. Establish staging areas for additional UMT assets.
- c. Direct UMTs to the areas where they are immediately needed.

7. Provide direction and control for RS activities and personnel.

- a. Establish mission control over RS functions.
- b. Develop situational understanding as the event unfolds.

8. Refine priorities for RS.

9. Keep commanders, staff and support personnel informed.

10. Provide relief and resupply to mobilized UMTs or other RS personnel.

11. As the situation culminates, focus RS care on first responders, MPs/police and medical caregivers as necessary.

12. Conduct After Action Review (AAR) to capture/refine lessons learned, best practices, tactics, technique and procedures.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

**Evaluation Guidance:** Score the Soldier a GO if all performance measures are passed. Score the Soldier a NO GO if any step is failed. If the Soldier fails any step, show or tell him/her what was done wrong and how to do it correctly.

**Evaluation Preparation:** **SETUP:** The evaluator may role play the part of EOC personnel. The evaluated Soldier should be able to describe how she/he would plan for religious support for a variety of critical event contingencies, integrate the plan, rehearse and execute it. **BRIEF SOLDIER:** Tell the Soldier that HAZMAT spill has resulted in dozens of casualties across the installation. Have the Soldier describe the actions they may have taken to prepare for such a contingency according to the task steps, and how they might execute and coordinate emergency RS during this critical event.

Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT.

**Safety:** In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with FM 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete a DA Form 7566 COMPOSITE RISK MANAGEMENT WORKSHEET during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
