Condition: The command receives a mission order from higher headquarters and the commander issues guidance on planning restoration of public safety. The command establishes communications with subordinate and adjacent units, and higher headquarters. The mission command system is operational and processing information. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4.

Standard: The staff develops a plan to restore public safety by coordinating the security, safety, and care for displaced communities in camps and settlements, the movement of displaced people, the screening of returnees at checkpoints, and the protection of relief convoys. The staff develops a plan for public safety in returnee communities that lack local law and order. The staff follows commanders intent and standard operating procedures.

TASK STEPS

1. The staff plans the initial phase to restore public safety which includes:

a. Protect vulnerable elements of the population.

b. Accessing endangered populations.

(1) Protect humanitarian aid with security forces.

(2) Protect access to refugee camps.

(3) Provide a means for civilians to report on belligerents.

c. Performing civil police functions.

(1) Locate and safeguard key witnesses, documents, and other evidence related to ongoing or potential investigations and prosecutions.

(2) Establish procedures to control crowds, prevent looting, and manage civil disturbances.

(3) Secure facilities, records, storage equipment, and funds related to criminal justice and security institutions.

(4) Protect strategically important institutions:

(a) Government buildings.

(b) Museums.

(c) Religious sites.

(d) Courthouses.

(5) Identify, secure, and protect:

(a) Conventional weapons.

(b) Chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and high yield explosives.

(6) Protect military facilities and means of communications:

(a) Military depots.

(b) Equipment.

(c) Ammunition dumps.

(d) Means of communication.

2. The staff develops plans that prepare for the host nation (HN) transformation and assesses HN military forces to determine:

a. Capacity to protect military infrastructure.

In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT. .

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. .
