1. Develop Near/Long term training calendar (UF 496)
2. Identify individual type of training needed
 - a. Review UF 1137's for training indicators
 - b. Review previous training sign in rosters
3. Plan the training to be conducted
 - a. Identify the location of training recon/site survey
 - b. Identify resources required for the training
 - c. Identify personnel/instructors for key tasks taught i.e. Drill Sergeants
 - d. Complete Composite Risk Management (CRM)
 - e. Obtain approval for high risk events
 - f. Coordinate transportation of future Soldiers
 - g. Time for Future Soldiers to be promoted off of the UF 1137 completed.
 - h. Build UF496 for training and input into DTMS.
4. Conduct training
 - a. Set up site prior to the Future Soldiers arrival
 - b. Conduct Composite Risk Management (CRM) brief
 - c. Sign in roster (UF 496)and enter into DTMS.
 - d. Complete liability waiver form(s) (If applicable)
 - e. Collect referrals on UF 1116; pencil in phone number or contact information
5. Conduct AAR with all attendees
 - a. Update UF 1137's
 - b. Forward completed UF 1137to company for commanders signature
 - c. Schedule promotions for next Future Soldier event or training.
 - d. Update Recruiter Zone

Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
