Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4.

Standards: Prepare an aid bag in accordance with (IAW) Prehospital Trauma Life Support, Military Edition, 9th and Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC) guidelines ensuring appropriate supplies for the mission, while adhering to all warnings, and cautions, without error, using the task GO/NO-GO checklist.
