Condition: Given a commander's order for movement, reconnaissance information, a load plan, map w/ overlays, compass, march tables, vehicles, howitzers, ammunition, propellant, fuzes, service equipment, a personal items and equipment. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP.

Standard: Direct battery displacement from a position area so that the equipment and weapon systems are loaded and prepared for movement within the commander's timeline, mission requirements, and without damaging equipment IAW information listed in Chapter 2 of FM 6-50.

Performance Steps

1. Receive movement order.
 - a. Evaluate METT-TC considerations.
 - b. Evaluate guidance on position areas, AOFs, routes, order of march, etc.
2. Evaluate the threat of improvised explosive devices (IED).
3. Determine displacement method.
 - a. Determine which type of march to employ.
 - (1) Employ road march.
 - (2) Employ terrain march.
 - b. Organize movement.
 - (1) Organize march column.
 - (2) Establish march column contingencies.
 - (3) Ensure each vehicle knows their convoy security responsibilities.
 - (4) Ensure key personnel are dispersed/spread out throughout the column.
4. Direct deliberate displacement.
 - a. Issue the warning order.
 - b. Provide general movement guidance.
 - (1) Inform unit members on the location of the next position and azimuth of fire.
 - (2) Provide guidance on checkpoints, rally points, time of arrival, rate of march, etc.
 - (3) Provide guidance on restriction such as maximum speed, catch-up speed, use of lights etc.
 - (4) Provide guidance on use of communications.
 - c. Direct movement preparations.
 - (1) Ensure section equipment is stowed.
 - (2) Ensure ammunition, fuzes, and propellant are loaded into ammunition vehicles.
 - (3) Ensure camouflage nets are stowed.
 - (4) Ensure all service elements are loaded.

(5) Stow the collimator and equipment forward of the howitzers just prior to initiating movement.

(6) Stow communication equipment just prior to initiating movement.

d. Ensure continuous security.

e. Initiate movement.

5. Direct emergency displacement.

a. Provide unit members guidance on OPSEC considerations.

b. Provide unit members guidance on denial and destruction procedures.

c. Provide general movement instructions.

d. Direct movement preparations.

e. Ensure continuous security.

f. Initiate movement.

g. Employ concealment techniques if unit is under threat of attack.
