Condition: Given a tactical environment, a battalion OPORD, higher command Religious Support Plan, access to tactical displays, maps, overlays, printed graphics, and a requirement to provide information of what the unit and UMT is doing in the operational area. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP.

Standard: Determine pertinent information from graphical information in order to develop Religious Support plans and operations that meet the higher headquarters intent and timelines, while meeting all seven performance measures.

Special Condition: None

Safety Level: Low

MOPP: Sometimes

Cue: This task is cued when the battalion UMT is in receipt of higher headquarter mission orders and graphics for an upcoming mission.

Performance Steps

1. Understand the Commander's intent for the current operation.
2. Acquire the Concept of the Operation graphic, Course of Action sketch, other maps, graphics or overlays.
3. Review the material for a graphic depiction of the following:
 - a. The main effort of the operation.
 - b. Assembly areas, battle positions, strong points, engagement areas and objectives.
 - c. Casualty collection points, ambulance exchange points, the forward aid station, the forward logistics element.
 - d. Locations of command posts and communications nodes.
 - e. Line of departure, line of contact or phase lines.
 - f. Unit movement formations and the axis of advance.
 - g. Obstacles and fire support coordination measures.
 - h. Tactical mission graphics
 - i. Enemy locations and civilian populations.
 - j. Task organization and composition.
 - k. Any future, planned operations or positions.
 - l. Recent significant activity such as troops in contact, small arms fire, or attack by improvised explosive device.
4. Visualize the operation for Religious Support using the graphics.
 - a. Determine the phases of the operation and operational timelines.
 - b. Begin backward planning Religious Support.
 - c. Determine who the main effort is and where/when/how they can best be provided for prior to the start of the operation.
 - d. Determine which other units in the task organization will need Religious Support prior to the start of the operation and where/when/how to best provide for them.
 - e. Determine furthest forward point in the casualty evacuation plan where the UMT could most effectively care for the wounded during the operation.
 - f. Determine which Tactical Operations Center, Tactical Command Post, or Command Post could be used by the UMT for communication, reporting, security and situational awareness.

Note: The forward aid station is often co-located with some form of forward command post just a few kilometers behind the main effort, making planning and execution much easier for the UMT.
 - g. Determine any hazards to UMT.

5. Compile the information and backbrief your chaplain.
6. Update the Religious Staff Estimate in conjunction with your chaplain.
7. Prepare courses of action and continue planning, in conjunction with your chaplain.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Soldier a GO if all performance measures are followed. Score the Soldier a NO GO if any step is failed. If the Soldier fails any step, show or tell them what was done wrong and how to do it correctly.

Evaluation Preparation: Setup: Tell the Soldier that their battalion staff has just received an mission order and graphics from their higher headquarters. Using operational concept graphics, mission graphics, CONOPS, sketches, maps overlays or digital displays, have the Soldier extract the essential details from the graphics which are necessary for Religious Support planning.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT. Environmental protection is a continual process. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment and reduce waste.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with FM 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete a DA Form 7566 COMPOSITE RISK MANAGEMENT WORKSHEET during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Everyone is responsible for safety. A thorough risk assessment must be completed prior to every mission or operation.
