The Soldier establishes communications with unit members, subordinate and adjacent units, and higher headquarters, as required. The unit and higher headquarters operations security plans are available. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4. This task should be trained under IED Threat conditions.

Standard: The Soldier employs operational security protective measures, protects friendly information, and implements improvements to the units operational security posture in accordance with applicable publications, standing operating procedures, and the commander's guidance. The operations security plan complies with the commander and higher headquarters' intent, needs of the unit, and achieves the desired operational security end state.

Performance Steps

1. The Soldier integrates operations security (OPSEC) throughout the troop leading procedure process by:
 - a. Complying with the commander's intent, standard operating procedures, and desired end state.
 - b. Aligning OPSEC planning with the operational environment.
 - c. Implementing Army OPSEC measures in accordance with applicable regulations and publications.
2. The Soldier directs subordinates to implement the OPSEC process by:
 - a. Identifying critical information in accordance with (IAW) the commander and higher headquarters' guidance, intent, and concept of the operation.
 - b. Integrating the intelligence section's analysis and identification of the threat's capabilities against identified critical information.
 - c. Identifying and analyzing OPSEC vulnerabilities that will negatively impact mission execution.
 - d. Assessing related risks impacting the unit's mission execution and established OPSEC measures.
 - e. Applying OPSEC measures/countermeasures to increase the unit's operational effectiveness by:
 - (1) Enforcing established OPSEC policies and the unit's applicable standing operating procedures.
 - (2) Directing assigned Soldiers to implement and follow established OPSEC measures.
3. The Soldier monitors and evaluates the execution and implementation of OPSEC measures to:
 - a. Assess the effectiveness of OPSEC measures.
 - (1) Verifies that documents and logs protect sensitive information.
 - (2) Validates SOPs to identify which documents require OPSEC review.
 - (3) Validates standards for protecting, storing, and handling sensitive information and mission command systems.
 - (4) Recommends corrective action, as required.
 - b. Recommend changes to OPSEC measures based on on-going assessments.
4. The Soldier implements improvements to OPSEC measures throughout the mission.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Soldier GO if he/she passes all performance measures. Score the Soldier NO-GO if Soldier fails any performance measure. If the Soldier scores NO-GO, show the Soldier why he/she failed and show the Soldier how to perform the measure correctly.

Evaluation Preparation: Brief the Soldier: Explain expectations to the Soldier by reviewing the task standards. Stress to the Soldier the importance of observing all cautions and warnings to avoid injury to personnel and, if applicable, damage to equipment.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
