Conditions:

The command receives a report from an information collection asset of an enemy formation or unit in the commands operational area and a request from that information collection asset for guidance to destroy, neutralize, suppress, or bypass. The commander issues guidance on conducting dynamic targeting. The command establishes communications with higher, lower, and adjacent units, and the mission command system is operating and processing information.

Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4.

Standards:

The staff conducts dynamic targeting to create desired effects on the target. The staff informs the commander and responds to the report within established time limits. The staff follows commanders guidance and standard operating procedures.

Drill Statements:

WARNING

Follow guidelines within Unit SOP and local regulations.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to the current Environmental Considerations manual and the current GTA Environmental-related Risk Assessment card. Follow guidelines within Unit SOP and local regulations.

TASK STEPS

1. The staff conducts dynamic targeting by:

- a. Directing the information collection asset to continue to maintain observation and awareness of the target's location and activity.
- b. Determining to engage the target in some manner.
- c. Selecting and coordinating the means to engage the target.

2. The staff conducts the following:

Note: This step involves the staff accomplishing the tasks by staff or warfighting functions (WfF).

- a. The intelligence WfF determines the possible identity of the target based on location and activity.
- b. The intelligence WfF confirms, denies, or modifies their Situation and Event Templates based on the Situation, Position, Observation, Task (SPOT) report.
- c. The Fires WfF determines if the target is on the high payoff target list (HPTL).
- d. The Fires WfF employs the Attack Guidance Matrix to determine the effect and pre-determined delivery system for the target type.
- e. The Judge Advocate determines if there is a requirement for a collateral damage estimate (CDE).
- f. The Fires WfF conducts CDE Analysis (if necessary).
- g. The Judge Advocate determines release authority for delivery system and/or target type.
- h. The Mission Command WfF sends SPOT Report to release authority and delivery system to initiate action on the target.

3. The staff requests battle damage assessment (BDA) from information collection asset to determine achievement of desired effect.

4. The staff coordinates with controlling headquarters to determine whether to re-engage or end the mission.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

TASK MEASURES

1. The staff conducted dynamic targeting.
 2. The staff conducted the following:
 - a. The intelligence WfF determined the possible identity of the target based on location and activity.
 - b. The intelligence WfF confirmed, denied, or modified their Situation and Event Templates based on the Situation, Position, Observation, Task (SPOT) report.
 - c. The Fires WfF determined if the target was on the high payoff target list (HPTL).
 - d. The Fires WfF employed the Attack Guidance Matrix to determine the effect and pre-determined delivery system for the target type.
 - e. The Judge Advocate determined if there is a requirement for a collateral damage estimate (CDE).
 - f. The Fires WfF conducted CDE Analysis (if necessary).
 - g. The Judge Advocate determined release authority for delivery system and/or target type.
 - h. The Mission Command WfF sent SPOT Report to release authority and delivery system to initiate action on the target.
 3. The staff requested battle damage assessment (BDA) from information collection asset to determine achievement of desired effect.
 4. The staff coordinated with controlling headquarters to determine whether to re-engage or end the mission.
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Talk:

a.Orientation: The object of this drill is to conduct dynamic targeting.

b.Safety: Enforce the unit SOP and local training regulations.

c.Demonstration: Conduct a staff level rehearsal of concept (ROC) drill.

d.Explanation: Refer to performance measures and explain what each staff member must do to conduct dynamic targeting.

e.Unit Instructions: The Staff is coordinating current operations and receives a report from an information collection asset of an enemy formation or unit in the command's operational area and a request from that information collection asset for guidance to destroy, neutralize, suppress, or bypass.

Walk:

1. Continue to rehearse to increase the flow of information and speed of decisions.
 2. Refer to performance measures and have staff members perform their tasks as the leader walks the entire staff through the drill.
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Run:

a.Run-Through Instructions: The staff should rehearse this drill until they can perform the drill according to the standard and without the drill book or coaching form the leader.

b.Coaching Point: Ensure SOP is current. Continue to rehearse this drill until the staff has mastered all steps within the drill.

c.Performance Instructions: The staff conducts dynamic targeting to create desired effects on the target. The staff informs the commander and responds to the report within established time limits. The staff follows commander's guidance and standard operating procedures.
