

ART 7.6.1.4 Conduct Arms Control Operations

Army forces normally conduct arms control operations to support arms control treaties and enforcement agencies. Army forces can help locate, seize, and destroy weapons of mass destruction after hostilities. Other actions include escorting deliveries of weapons and materials (such as enriched uranium) to preclude loss or unauthorized use, inspecting and monitoring production and storage facilities, and training foreign forces to secure weapons and facilities. Army forces may conduct arms control operations to prevent escalation of a conflict and reduce instability. This could include the mandated disarming of belligerents as part of a peace operation. (FM 3-07) (USACAC)
