**Condition:** Given a requirement for Religious Support within the battalion area of operations, information pertaining to METT-TC analysis, access to the battalion TOC, access to a vehicle. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4.

**Standard:** Demonstrate comprehensive security planning and execution for the UMT by performing all 16 task steps in order; assess all threats/risks to the UMT; implement mitigations to deal with each identified threat/risk; coordinate with teams, squad, platoons or companies for the timely rehearsal and movement of the UMT; incorporate the UMT with local base defense; assure that the UMT is postured to deal with threats during worship IAC with step 13.

## Performance Steps

1. Identify a potential Religious Support mission:
  - a. Worship service
  - b. Counseling or troop visitation
  - c. Soldier/Leader Engagement involving the chaplain and a local religious figure.
2. Analyze the threats to the UMT using METT-TC and OAKOC.
3. Develop appropriate mitigations, drills, reactions and movement techniques specific to the UMT.
4. Determine if the need for the mission outweighs the potential catastrophic loss of one or more members of the UMT.
5. Identify an appropriate formation, vehicle or other means for UMT movement.
  - a. Convoy
  - b. Aircraft
  - c. Dismounted patrol
  - d. UMT buddy team movement
6. Attend all rehearsals and pre-mission briefs.
  - a. Complete all necessary documentation for authorized movement.
  - b. Ascertain the essential details of the movement such as time and place of departure; order of march. position of the UMT within the formation, etc.
  - c. Explain the implications of the non-combatant role of the chaplain; the dedicated force protection role of the Chaplain Assistant; and the actions of the UMT in the event of casualties.
  - d. Rehearse any plans, drills, reactions on contact with the unit chaplain and other critical personnel.
7. Integrate the UMT into a formation, vehicle or other means as necessary.
8. Execute the movement.
9. Arrive at the new location.
10. Assess the threat at the new location.
11. Determine hasty procedures for UMT actions on contact, a rally point, cover/concealment, accountability procedures and team movement.
12. Coordinate with local base defense operations cell (BDOC), company First Sergeant, platoon sergeant or other local leadership for UMT incorporation into the local security plan.
13. Provide security as the chaplain performs religious services:

a. Control entry to the facility or area if non-DOD personnel are present.

b. Ensure the UMT has a plan for dispersal or evacuation of personnel in the event of direct/indirect fire attack or active shooter insider threat.

c. Remain postured to respond to any potential dynamic event and ensure the safety of the UMT and any worshippers.

14. Return to base - repeat steps 5 through 9.

15. Hotwash the mission.

16. Refine UMT force protection procedures based on observations, insights and lessons learned.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

**Evaluation Guidance:** Score the Soldier a GO if all performance measures are passed. Score the Soldier a NO GO if any step is failed. If the Soldier fails any step, show or tell him/her what was done wrong and how to do it correctly.

**Evaluation Preparation:** SETUP: The evaluator may role play the part of a ground convoy commander. Have another Soldier play the part of the Chaplain. The evaluated Soldier should be able to develop UMT specific risk mitigations, drills and actions on contact.

BRIEF SOLDIER: Tell the Soldier that Charlie Company is requesting a chapel service at Combat Outpost Wilson. Tell them that the only way to get there is with the twice a week logistics patrol convoy. Enemy forces have consistently attacked the LOGPAC for the last two weeks with small arms fire and IEDs. Tell the Soldier to assess the mission and the threat, determine if the risk is worth it and develop and practice drills, actions or other risk mitigations. The Soldier should integrate the UMT into the formation according to the steps below. The evaluator may simulate enemy attacks to evaluate the executions of the drills.

In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT.

**Safety:** In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
