1. Review OPORD.
 - a. Determine if current FRAGOs and other mission changes effect planned religious support.
 - b. Inform command of changes to religious support plan, if required.
2. Review Religious Support Plan/Religious Support Matrix.
 - a. Analyze Phases of Operation.
 - b. Determine Priority of Religious Support.
 - c. Coordinate with appropriate sections to conduct religious support.
3. Identify Religious Support Requirements.
 - a. Determine faith group coverage requirements and coordinates with supervisory chaplain, if required.
 - b. Ensure DFGL, coverage, if required.
 - c. Plan for ecclesiastical requirements for significant faith group holy days.
4. Execute Plan.
 - a. Supervise DFGL.
 - b. Provide appropriate ecclesiastical requirements.
 - c. Inform command of religious support coverage.
5. Track emerging situation and identifies any new/changed religious requirements.
 - a. Determine requirements to changing situation.
 - b. Coordinate for changes in requirements.
6. Redeploy assets and responds to new requirements.
 - a. Determine changes to religious support plan/matrix.
 - b. Provide FRAGO for changes to religious support plan, if required.
 - c. Brief new requirements to command.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Soldiers should be evaluated based on their ability to perform the tasks in accordance with the performance measures listed in the TSP. Soldiers who miss any performance measure should be retrained and reevaluated.

Evaluation Preparation: To evaluate this task, ensure that required materials (OPORD, Religious Support Plan/Matrix) are available. Tell the Soldier to perform the required planning steps for religious support, determine a need, and execute a plan to meet the need.

Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.
