Conditions:

The command receives a report of a collateral damage incident within the area of operations. The command is conducting operations in accordance with published operations plan, warning, operations, or fragmentary order. The command establishes communications with subordinate and adjacent units and higher headquarters. The mission command system is operational and processing information. The commander issues guidance on reacting to significant collateral damage and identifies commanders critical information requirements and serious incident report requirements.

Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4. This task should be trained under IED Threat conditions.

Standards:

The command reacts to a collateral damage incident following commanders guidance and standard operating procedures and within established timeline. The staff receives the initial report and immediately informs the commander and higher headquarters and conducts hasty mission analysis, alerts and deploys quick reaction force, informs all relevant stakeholders, continuously monitors the situation, and updates the common operational picture.

Drill Statements:

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Follow guidelines within Unit SOP and local regulations.

Environment: Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to the current Environmental Considerations manual and the current GTA Environmental-related Risk Assessment card. Follow guidelines within Unit SOP and local regulations.

Cue: The command post (CP) receives initial report of collateral damage incident in the area of responsibility via mission command systems.

Note: Follow guidelines within Unit SOP and local regulations.

Coaching Point: Ensure SOP is current. Continue to practice how to execute this drill until the staff has mastered the drill.

TASK STEPS

1. The command post (CP) radio telephone operator (RTO) receives an initial report of a collateral damage incident in the area of responsibility.

Note: The Radio and Telephone Operator (RTO) should obtain the information in size, activity, location, unit, time and equipment (SALUTE) or size, activity, location, and time (SALT) formats and primary and secondary means of communication for maintaining contact with reporting unit or in accordance with (IAW) unit standard operating procedure (SOP).

2. RTO immediately informs the current operations integration cell Battle NCO/officer who will:

- a. Log entry into event log on mission command system.
- b. Monitor for further reports.

3. The current operations integration cell Battle Captain will:

- a. Inform S3/G3 or Chief of current operations integration cell, higher headquarters (HQ), and all major support commands.
- b. Confirm liaisons of units involved continue to gather information and that unaffected liaisons analyze the situation for any impacts on their units.
- c. Send the SALUTE or SALT report to higher HQ.
- d. Update S3/G3 or Chief of current operations integration cell with information from liaisons or higher headquarters.

4. Chief of current operations integration cell, Battle Captain/NCO, or S3/G3 will:

- a. Communicate attention in the CP and announce the collateral damage incident.
- b. Inform Commander, Chief of Staff (CoS), and Executive Officer (XO).
- c. Conduct a hasty mission analysis to identify courses of actions and priorities:

- (1) Alert/Deploy the quick reaction force to provide security (as necessary).
- (2) Deploy air medical evacuation (MEDEVAC) (if necessary).
- (3) Alert the combat support hospital.
- (4) Deploy ground evacuation response forces (if necessary).
- (5) Request additional medical personnel from higher HQ (if necessary).
- (6) Deploy explosive ordnance disposal (EOD) assets (if necessary).
- (7) Direct units to increase force protection within the area of responsibility (if necessary).

d. Obtain current information of the situation from the current operations integration cell.

5. Current operations integration cell will:

- a. Obtain the following information in accordance with unit SOP:

- (1) Confirm location of collateral damage.
- (2) Obtain estimate of number of civilians killed or wounded.
- (3) Obtain estimate of damage to buildings and infrastructure.
- (4) Obtain type of weapon system or event causing the collateral damage incident.
- (5) Confirm the unit's mission at the time of the incident (if the unit's actions led to collateral damage).
- (6) Confirm follow up action taken by the unit in relation to:
 - (a) Casualty evacuation.
 - (b) Enemy situation.
 - (c) Status of locals.

b. Notify and coordinate with local authorities, intergovernmental organizations, and unified action partners for support.

c. Monitor for further reports.

d. Initialize internal requirements IAW unit SOP, review/refine hasty analysis, develop recommendations, and provide input to:

- (1) S/G1 - Replacements, escorts, documents processing.
- (2) S/G2 – Trend/pattern analysis and graphic recreation of event.
- (3) S/G4 – Payments, Property destroyed, adjustment documents, and mortuary affairs.
- (4) S/G5 – Per SOP.
- (5) Information Operations (IO)/Psychological Operations (PSYOPS) – Per SOP.
- (6) Fire Support Element (FSE) – Prepare a Battle Damage Assessment (Collective Task 71-8-5146).
- (7) G3, Air/Air Liaison Officer (Air MEDEVAC) - Per SOP.
- (8) Public Affairs Officer - Flash Public Affairs traffic & prepare statement-Per SOP.
- (9) Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) - Per SOP.
- (10) Inspector General (IG) - Per SOP.
- (11) Chemical Officer- Per SOP.
- (12) Chaplain - Per SOP.

e. Inform higher HQ with situational updates IAW SOP.

6. Chief of current operations integration cell or S3/G3 will:

- a. Obtain the common operational picture from the current operations integration cell.
 - b. Receive recommendations from the staff.
 - c. Develop current operations assessment and brief the commander, COS, or XO.
- * 7. Commander, COS, or XO provides guidance on operations to the Chief of current operations integration cell or S3/G3.
8. Chief of current operations integration cell or S3/G3 integrates the commander's guidance and supervises execution of guidance.
- (Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

TASK MEASURES

1. The command post (CP) received an initial report of a collateral damage incident in the area of responsibility.
 2. The RTO immediately informed the current operations integration cell Battle NCO/officer.
 3. The current operations integration cell Battle Captain/NCO informed all units within the area of operations.
 4. Chief of current operations integration cell, Battle Captain/NCO, or S3/G3 informed the CP and conducted a hasty mission analysis.
 5. Current operations integration cell confirmed the incident and coordinated with all staff sections.
 6. Chief of current operations integration cell or S3/G3 developed the current operations assessment and briefed the commander, COS, or XO.
 7. The Commander, COS, or XO provided guidance on operations to the Chief of current operations integration cell or S3/G3.
 8. Chief of current operations integration cell or S3/G3 integrated the commander's guidance and supervised execution of guidance.
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Talk:

a.Orientation: The object to this drill is to react to a report of a collateral damage within the area of operations.

b.Safety: Emphasizing the SOP ensures the most efficient response to a report of collateral damage incident to limit the loss of life and property.

c.Demonstration: Conduct a Staff rehearsal of concept (ROC) drill.

d.Explanation: Refer to performance measures and explain what each staff member must do to react to a report of collateral damage.

e.Unit Instructions: The Staff is coordinating current operations and receives a report of collateral damage within the area of operations.

Walk:

1. Continue to rehearse to increase the flow of information, and speed of decisions.
 2. Refer to performance measures and have staff members perform their tasks as the leader walks the entire staff through the drill.
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Run:

a.Run-Through Instructions: The staff should rehearse this drill until they can perform the drill according to the standard and without the drill book or coaching from the leader.

b.Coaching Point: Ensure SOP is current. Continue to practice how to execute this drill until the staff has mastered the drill.

c.Performance Instructions: When the staff can perform this drill according to the standards, the leader should evaluate them and conduct an after action review (AAR).
