2. Analyze the mission.
 - a. Determine available UMT assets and agencies involved with the program.
 - b. Identify facts.
 - c. List assumptions.
 - d. List specified tasks.
 - e. List implied tasks.
 - f. List constraints and limitations.
3. Coordinate with S3 for mission requirements and program scheduling.
 - a. Coordinate date, time and location for event.
 - b. Ensure event is placed on the unit training calendar IAW unit SOP or regulation.
 - c. Coordinate participant requirements with Company commanders/First Sergeants and FRG Leaders
4. Develop program.
 - a. Develop outline for program.
 - b. Coordinate with additional presenters for topics that will presented, if needed.
5. Determine resource requirements for program.
 - a. Coordinate with appropriate section for equipment.
 - b. Coordinate with appropriate section for transportation/logistic support.
 - c. Secure facility for program.
 - d. Inform program presenters of date, time and location of program.
6. Brief commander and supervisory chaplain on program.
 - a. Inform commander and supervisory chaplain of date, time and location and topics of event.
 - b. Obtain commander's approval.

Refer to the current Environmental Considerations manual and the current GTA Environmental-related Risk Assessment card. Environmental protection is a continual process. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment and reduce waste.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination. Everyone is responsible for safety. A thorough risk assessment must be completed prior to every mission or operation.
