 - a. Attempt to reduce or minimize the impact of the incident.

3. Report insecurity.
 - a. U.S. Army Counterintelligence Support Unit will be notified of all reportable COMSEC Incidents immediately upon discovery.
 - b. Formal written reports are required within 24 to 72 hours depending on the type of incident.

Environment: All operations must conform to the Army Environmental Program, TC 3-34.489 (The Soldier and the Environment), 3-34.5 (ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS {MCRP 4-11B}), AR 200-1 Environmental Protection and Enhancement), local, state, and federal environmental policies, The Clean Air Act (CAA), CAA amendments, National Ambient Air-Quality Standards (NAAQS), as well as OSHA Hazard Communication Standard for Industry, 29 CFR, part 1910.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with FM 5-19, Composite Risk Management. Leaders will complete a DA Form 7566 COMPOSITE RISK MANAGEMENT WORKSHEET during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, NBC Protection, FM 3-11.5, CBRN Decontamination. Incidental to Army operations and activities, all operations must provide for public safety, safe and healthful workplaces, procedures and equipment. Observe all safety precautions when using lifting devices and handling heavy parts. Observe all safety and/or environmental precautions regarding electricity, radiation, radio frequency (RF), fuel, lubricants, high pressures, and refrigerants. Provide ventilation for exhaust fumes during equipment operation and use hearing protection when required in accordance with AR 385-10 (The Army Safety Program), The Clear Air Act (CAA), CAA amendments, National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), and the OSHA Communication Standard.
