Condition: You are the brigade CBRN officer/NCO, given FM 3-11.19 and unit standing operating procedures (SOP). The brigade is providing CBRN reconnaissance in support of force combat operations. A CBRN reconnaissance plan/overlay was approved, disseminated, and rehearsed as part of the S2's initial intelligence collection plan. You have to coordinate support for the CBRN reconnaissance mission. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4.

Standard: Coordinate execution of CBRN reconnaissance operations by ensuring all mission critical support functions are allocated IAW unit SOPs.

Performance Steps

1. Coordinate security for the reconnaissance assets.
2. Coordinate passage of lines with adjacent units.
3. Coordinate engineer support (decontamination site support, enemy/friendly obstacles, etc).
4. Coordinate logistical support (medical, maintenance, technical escort, supplies, mortuary affairs, individual protective equipment, resupply after decontamination, etc).
5. Coordinate fire support (target reference point allocation, coordinated fire line, restrictive fire measures, primary/alternate communications, etc).
6. Coordinate host nation support, if available.
7. Coordinate communication support (retransmission or special equipment).
8. Coordinate decontamination support.
9. Obtain S2/intelligence update (weather, terrain updates, known or suspected enemy locations, recent enemy activity, civilians in the area, priority intelligence requirements, etc).
10. Update CBRN reconnaissance support plan.
11. Brief the CBRN reconnaissance support plan to the reconnaissance team leadership using the five-paragraph operations order (OPORD) format.
 - a. Situation.
 - b. Mission.
 - c. Execution.
 - d. Sustainment.
 - e. Command and control.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the Soldier GO if all performance measures are passed (P). Score the Soldier NO-GO if any performance measure is failed (F). If the Soldier scores NO-GO, show the Soldier what was done wrong and how to do it correctly.

Evaluation Preparation: Setup: Provide the Soldier with the items listed in the task condition statement.

Brief Soldier: Tell the Soldier to coordinate the execution of CBRN reconnaissance operations.
