

### ART 4.1.1.4 Substitute Parts

Remove serviceable parts, components, and assemblies from unserviceable, economically repairable equipment, or from materiel authorized for disposal. Immediately reuse it in restoring a like item to a combat-operable or serviceable condition. ART 4.1.1.4 includes controlled exchange of parts and cannibalization. (FM 4-30.3) (CASCOM)

01	Yes/No	Unit substitution policy increased the unit's available combat power.
02	Yes/No	Procedures for the substitution of parts were implemented with the applicable environmental considerations.
03	Time	To refine substitution policy after receipt of warning order.
04	Time	To diagnose and determine subsystem availability and to perform substitution to return major combat equipment to service.
05	Percent	Of equipment unavailable due to substitution and cannibalization.
06	Percent	Of substitutions completed using salvage and disposal materiel.
07	Percent	Of substitutions completed using authorized cannibalization within unit.
