 - c. Receive the report:
 - (1) Give the command "Receive the report".
 - (2) Give the command "Report".
 - d. Report to the Commander.
 - e. Dismiss the Company.
2. Conduct Company level formation as a Platoon Sergeant:
 - a. Give the command "fall in" and or call the Platoon to "attention".
 - b. Ensure correct positioning and distance from the Platoon.
 - c. Align the Platoon.
 - d. Receive and report.
3. Conduct Change of Responsibility IAW FM 3-21.5:
 - a. Formation of Troops.
 - b. Presentation and Honors.
 - c. Inspection.
 - d. Honor to the nation.
 - e. Remarks

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)
