Conditions:

The command receives an operations plan, or a warning, operations, or fragmentary order from higher headquarters and is exercising mission command. The commander issues guidance on processing relevant information. The command establishes communications with subordinate and adjacent units, and higher headquarters. The mission command system is operational and processing information.

Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP 4.

Standards:

The staff reacts to incorrect information affecting the operational environment by processing all information and identifying the incorrect information and its effects on the mission. The staff informs all units of the misinformation and develops courses of action to revise plans and operations as necessary. The staff coordinates all actions according to established timelines, the commanders intent, and standard operating procedures and while maintaining, sharing, and conducting continuous operations.

Drill Statements:

WARNING

Proper utilization of the Risk Assessment and unit SOP to lower the risk level.

Safety: In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with ATP 5-19, Risk Management. Leaders will complete the current Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet in accordance with the TRADOC Safety Officer during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, Multiservice Tactics,

Techniques, and Procedures for Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) Protection, FM 3-11.5, Multiservice Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Decontamination.

In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT. .

Cue: The command identifies incorrect information in the mission order and/or the common operating picture (COP).

Coaching Point: Validate the SOP is current and the staff is familiar with the performance measure within this drill.

TASK STEPS

1. The staff member who identifies the incorrect information immediately notifies the Deputy Commanding Officer (DCO), Chief of Staff (COS), or Executive Officer (XO) of the incorrect information.
2. The DCO, COS, or XO assembles all staff section leaders to analyze the situation by:
 - a. Determining and briefing whether the misinformation affects their warfighting functions (WfF).
 - b. Developing alternate courses of action (if necessary).
3. The DCO, COS, or XO briefs the Commander on the misinformation and results of the staff analysis.
- * 4. The Commander issues guidance to the DCO, COS, or XO.
5. The current operations integration cell immediately notifies all units within the operational environment (OE) and:
 - a. Directs them to analyze the impact on their operations.
 - b. Directs them to report results of their analysis.
 - c. Directs them to standby for a possible fragmentary order (FRAGO) to the mission.
6. The staff conducts hasty mission analysis and produces a mission brief.
7. The DCO, COS, or XO provides a mission brief to the Commander.
- * 8. The commander issues further guidance.
9. The staff develops and publishes the FRAGO with correct and relevant information.
10. The staff monitors the execution of the FRAGO within the OE.
11. The staff updates their running estimates.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

TASK MEASURES

1. The staff member who identified the incorrect information immediately notified the Deputy Commanding Officer (DCO), Chief of Staff (COS), or Executive Officer (XO) of the incorrect information.
 2. The DCO, COS, or XO assembled all staff section leaders and analyzed the situation.
 3. The DCO, COS, or XO briefed the Commander on the misinformation and results of the staff analysis.
 4. The Commander issued guidance to the DCO, COS, or XO.
 5. The current operations integration cell immediately notified all units within the operational environment.
 6. The staff conducted a hasty mission analysis and produced a mission brief.
 7. The DCO, COS, or XO provided a mission brief to the Commander.
 8. The commander issued further guidance.
 9. The staff developed and published the FRAGO with correct and relevant information.
 10. The staff monitored the execution of the FRAGO within the OE.
 11. The staff updated their running estimates.
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Talk:

a.Orientation: The objective of this drill is to react to identify the incorrect information and develop a FRAGO to correct the mission order without degradation to the mission.

b.Safety: Emphasize that following the SOP and information protocols are critical for preventing compromise of the mission.

c.Demonstration: Have the staff conduct a rehearsal of concept of the SOP.

d.Explanation: Refer to the performance measures and explain what each member of the staff must do to react to incorrect information.

e.Unit Instructions: The Staff is coordinating current operations and identifies incorrect information in the mission order and/or the common operating picture (COP).

Walk:

1. Refer to the performance measures and have staff members perform their step slowly at first as the leader talks them through the process.
 2. Continue to rehearse, increase speed of execution each iteration.
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Run:

a.Run-Through Instructions: The staff should practice this drill until they can perform the drill according to the standards and without the drill book or coaching form the leader.

b.Coaching Point: Validate the SOP is current and the staff is familiar with the performance measure within this drill.

c.Performance Instructions: Rehearse this Drill IAW performance measures.
