Notes: Whenever a vessel or any other floating equipment damages waterfront property owned or controlled by the Army, the property accountable officer of the pier, wharf, or other waterfront facility reports the damage on DA Form 285 and records the damage in the vessel log.

Logbooks will be prepared according to instructions in AR 56-9. Logbooks and other pertinent records must be preserved for use in claims against the United States for damage caused by Army watercraft and for affirmative claim by the United States for damage to Army property caused by other vessels or floating objects. Requirements for preserving deck and engine logs as well as other records are in AR 27-series regulations (Legal Services). Headquarters, Department of the Army (HQDA) Department of the Army Judge Advocate (DAJAZA) will be notified when a log (or any portion of the log) is to be used in litigation or is to be withheld for any other legal proceedings. When no longer required for the legal proceedings, the log will be returned to the installation having command over the Army watercraft that was involved. Commanders having assigned watercraft will periodically review log requirements to ensure that logs are maintained according to provisions in AR 56-9. Watercraft less than 30 feet do not require maintenance of logs—provided adequate records are maintained by the unit.

Performance Steps

1. Read instructions in logbook.
2. Record information in daily deck page(s) of the logbook.
Note: Reserve components' nondrill dates will be entered in the log and annotated as "nonduty days".
3. Correct logbook errors.
 - a. Draw a single line through the original entry (in red ink) so the entry remains legible.
 - b. Record the new entry accurately and legibly.
 - c. Initial the correction.

Note: Correction will be initialed by the person making the original entry and also by the master or coxswain. Drills and inspections will be made or underlined in red ink IAW CFR 46 Para 97.35-1.

(Asterisks indicates a leader performance step.)

Evaluation Guidance: Score the soldier "GO" if all steps are passed (P). Score the soldier "NO-GO" if any step is failed (F). If the soldier fails any step, show what was done wrong and how to do it correctly.

Evaluation Preparation: Ensure that all information, references and equipment required to perform the task are available. Use the TC and the evaluation guide to score the soldier's performance. Brief the soldier. Tell the soldier what is required IAW the task conditions and standards.
