## TASK STEPS

1. The Staff Judge Advocate element provides personnel claims support in managing claims for and against the Army through the Army's claim program:

a. Investigate, process, and adjudicate claims in accordance with:

- (1) U.S. statute and regulations.
- (2) Department of Defense (DOD) directives.
- (3) International or interagency agreements.

b. Operate the Army claims program and supervise the area claims offices in managing claims:

- (1) Property damage of soldiers and employees arising incident to service.
- (2) Torts alleged against Army or DOD personnel.
- (3) Claims by the U.S. against individuals who injure Army personnel or damage Army property.

c. Settle claims within delegated authority and forward claims exceeding that authority to the appropriate settlement authority.

2. The Staff Judge Advocate element provides operational claims support in managing claims for and against the Army through the Army's claim program:

a. Investigate, process, and adjudicate claims in accordance with:

- (1) U.S. statute and regulations.
- (2) DOD directives.
- (3) International or interagency agreements.

b. Operate the Army claims program and supervise the area claims offices in managing claims:

- (1) Property damage of soldiers and employees arising incident to service in a joint operations area.
- (2) Torts alleged by host nation authorities or individuals against Army or DOD personnel.
- (3) Claims by the U.S. against individuals who injure Army personnel or damage Army property.

c. Settle claims within delegated authority and forward claims exceeding that authority to the appropriate settlement authority.

d. Investigate, process, and adjudicate claims not otherwise payable under the Foreign Claims Act through the Commanders Emergency Response Program.

**Environment:** Environmental protection is not just the law but the right thing to do. It is a continual process and starts with deliberate planning. Always be alert to ways to protect our environment during training and missions. In doing so, you will contribute to the sustainment of our training resources while protecting people and the environment from harmful effects. Refer to FM 3-34.5 Environmental Considerations and GTA 05-08-002 ENVIRONMENTAL-RELATED RISK ASSESSMENT.

**Safety:** In a training environment, leaders must perform a risk assessment in accordance with FM 5-19, Composite Risk Management. Leaders will complete a DA Form 7566 COMPOSITE RISK MANAGEMENT WORKSHEET during the planning and completion of each task and sub-task by assessing mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available-time available and civil considerations, (METT-TC). Note: During MOPP training, leaders must ensure personnel are monitored for potential heat injury. Local policies and procedures must be followed during times of increased heat category in order to avoid heat related injury. Consider the MOPP work/rest cycles and water replacement guidelines IAW FM 3-11.4, NBC Protection, FM 3-11.5, CBRN Decontamination. .
