Condition: The command has received an operations plan, or warning, operations, or fragmentary order from higher headquarters and is exercising mission command. The commander has issued guidance on conducting Inform and Influence Activities. The command has established communications with subordinate and adjacent units, and higher headquarters. The mission command networks, information systems, and facilities and equipment are operational and processing information in accordance with standard operating procedures. This task can be performed in hours of daylight or limited visibility in various environment conditions. The unit has received guidance on the rules of engagement. Some iterations of this task should be performed in MOPP.

Standard: The staff conducts information operations by conducting actions to influence, degrade, or destroy threat and potential threat command and control systems and protect friendly command and control. The staff integrates these activities with the other elements of the operation and its execution IAW FM 3-13, ADP 5-0, ADP 6-0.

Note: Task steps and performance measures may not apply to every staff, unit or echelon. Prior to evaluation, coordination should be made between evaluator and the evaluated staffs or units' higher headquarters to determine the performance measures that may not be evaluated.

- * 1. The commander uses mission command to create, process and integrate information to inform and influence selected audiences.
2. The unit employs enablers organic and external available Information Related Capabilities (IRCs) that are available to the commander to accomplish the information activities.
3. The unit conducts Inform and Influence Activities (IIA) to:
 - a. Inform domestic and global audiences.
 - b. Influence and develop relationships with foreign friendly, neutral and multinational partners.
 - c. Affect adversaries and enemies.
Note:
4. The unit conducts activities to support the inform line of effort to inform domestic , and foreign friendly audiences to ensure a thorough understanding of the units intentions and operations.
 - a. The unit conducts Public Affairs efforts at home and abroad.
 - b. The unit conducts or supports Military Information Support Operations (MISO) directed towards foreign audiences.
 - c. Soldier and leader engagement (SLE) supports both efforts as the unit seeks to inform develop relationships.
Note:
5. The unit utilizes command designated IRCs to support the influence line of effort in order to affect the attitudes, perceptions and behaviors of neutral, adversary and enemy audiences.
6. The unit continuously performs composite risk management.
7. The unit assesses the operation and recommends adjustments to the plan ensuring operations meet the higher commander's guidance and intent.
8. The unit complies with the rules of engagement.
